M Rotar: Application has been renewed over the last couple of years. Additional information requested and provided earlier this week, info is sufficient. Recommend with modifications.

B Wright: Put pipeline in then put in culvert?

S Leep: What is the construction timeline? When is the waterline installation?

M Rotar: Under construction right now. Temporary culvert will be in place for one month.

S Leep moved to place application on hold pending more information. Request applicant to talk to the city and engineers for final changes/end product, will review again in October board meeting. M Hansen seconds, and motion carries

Inspection Comments: Proposed 50' bridge length will adequately span the active channel and immediate

floodplain. Recommend a 60" culvert (round or squashed) for the side channel

located on the approach to bridge.

Comments:

M Rotar: Another good project – access across South Cottonwood Creek, will use bridge to span channel. Recommended moving bridge 100' downstream from location to a single thread of S Cottonwood Creek. Side channel may have impacts.

M Hansen: What is the diameter of the culvert?

M Rotar: 60" culvert, not very long

Modifications: 1) Recommend 100' downstream from current location to a single thread of the South Cottonwood Creek, 2) Recommend a 60" culvert (round or squashed) for the side channel located on the approach to the bridge using best management practices for culvert installation matching the grade of channel and providing proper bedding material (like gravel).

M Hansen moved to approve as modified with recommendations, B Wright seconds, and motion carries

1. 310 Violation Complaint #1: Michael Alexander Sirr and Elizabeth Sirr

Inspection Date: 9/8/2017 Complaint Number: GD 2C-17

Alleged Violator: Michael Alexander Sirr and Elizabeth Sirr

Perennial Stream: Bridger Creek

Natural of Complaint: The Sirrs have been depositing and piling up dead trees, logs, branches, metal rebar,

metal wires, chicken wire, plastic mesh netting, and other debris on the south bank of Bridger Creek across from my property. The purpose of such activity is presumably to "armor" their land, deflecting the flow of Bridger Creek northward, away from their property and toward my own, thus causing preferential erosion on my land and

preferential expansion of theirs.

Inspection Comments: It appears to be unsightly, but it is not a 310 violation.

Discussion:

B Wright: After viewing photos, it appears that this may not affect the function of the stream.

M Rotar: Not a 310 violation

S Leep moved that this is a non-violation, M Hansen seconds, and motion carries

Board Decision: This may not affect the function of the stream and therefore, this is not a 310

violation.

2. 310 Violation Complaint #2: MT DNRC & Robert and Lyndsey Kaufmann

Inspection Date: 9/15/2017 Complaint Number: GD 3C-17

Alleged Violator: Robert & Lyndsey Kaufmann + MT DNRC

Perennial Stream: Bear Creek

Natural of Complaint: A new bridge was constructed over Bear Creek on an access road just east of Bear

Canyon Road. The property is Montana Trust Land and the Kaufmann's hold a lease for a cabin site. The Kaufmann's confirmed the bridge construction to county officials

during a visit relating to concerns of Floodplain Regulation violations.

Inspection Comments: It appears that they put down a new deck and railing on an old existing bridge. The

banks look fine, don't need any mitigation. Will need an after-the-fact 310 permit.

Discussion:

S Leep: If they are using old abutments, would they need a 310?

M Hansen: Looks like a nice bridge.

M Hansen: Need to send a violation letter and Kaufmann's will need to submit an after-the-fact 310 application

M Hansen: Will need to copy MT DNRC too

M Hansen moved (below), S Leep seconds, and motion carries

Board Decision: Acknowledge complaint filed. Activity has been performed on a jurisdictional stream

for the purposes of 310 permitting.

No remedial action necessary for the work performed.

Require Mr. and Mrs. Kaufmann to file an after-the-fact 310 application for the work

performed.

Encourage Mr. and Mrs. Kaufmann to first file a 310 application for future work

proposed in Bear Creek.

Alleged Violator:

East Catron Creek

Perennial Stream: Natural of Complaint:

Culvert constructed on Catron Creek is not adequate for fish passage and could fail

due to head cutting.

Culvert is not inset/embedded

Culvert is not at grade

• There was no attempt to include aquatic organism passage (AOP)

 A significant amount of rip-rap has been placed at outlet in stream channel-this has produced a complete fish barrier

• This is fish bearing stream, aquatic fish passage is required, and this was relayed during permitting.

M Rotar: Dave was tipped off about an alleged violation on Catron Creek. The three-arched culvert was changed to a box culvert. There is 2' feet riprap, in essence a fish barrier with a drop to the channel.

D Moser: Something got lost in the translation. This should have been a natural channel design plus box culvert. The original three- arched culvert wasn't good for fish. There are three species of trout in Catron Creek.

M Rotar: This is a violation.

B Vaughn: Will find the drawing submitted. What are the options? Step pool construction, pull the culvert?

D Moser: Can create a drop structure at a minimum to pass fish

K Bilbo: It's difficult to create. S Leep: Can they dig down?

M Rotar/D Moser: It's a box culvert

D Moser: AOP culvert-needs more education on what to do to pass fish

J Meissner: Fisheries are becoming more and more of an issue with urban sprawl. Box culvert is a cheaper option than the free span bridge, which can be cost prohibitive, but if there's any other issue, perhaps go back to asking for more free span bridges.

C Mahony: Is there any interest in doing an education series?

B Wright: Should the permittee be responsible?

M Hansen: Two avenues of resolution: modify outlet as per approved plan (new 310 application) or remove it since it is not what was permitted in GD 10-16.

M Hansen move to declare this complaint as a 310 violation and require a new 310 application requiring methods of resolution, B Wright seconds, and motion carries

Board decision: Acknowledge complaint filed. Activity has been performed on a jurisdictional stream

for the purposes of 310 permitting.

Remedial action necessary for the work performed.

Require Dan Sampson to submit a new 310 application modifying outlet as per

#### **CD Reports: Planning Boards**

L Blanksma mentioned that the County Planning Board met on June 27<sup>th</sup> to discuss a project on Story Mill Road. The proposal was for approval of four lots in a 43-acre parcel. Each lot is six acres with a buffer. There will be an open space area of 17 ½ acres.

He also reported that there wasn't anything else of interest except for the discussion on the landfill. There are no leakage problems going uphill from the landfill.

On July 28<sup>th</sup>, the Ft. Ellis Leisure Community was discussed. This proposal was for 17 single home sites in a 29-acre parcel with an open space area of 10-acres. Each lot will be 1 to 1 ½ acres. This is near the Bozeman Trail. They will also have an underground 30,000-gallon tank for fire retention.
